COMMUNITY RELATIONS.

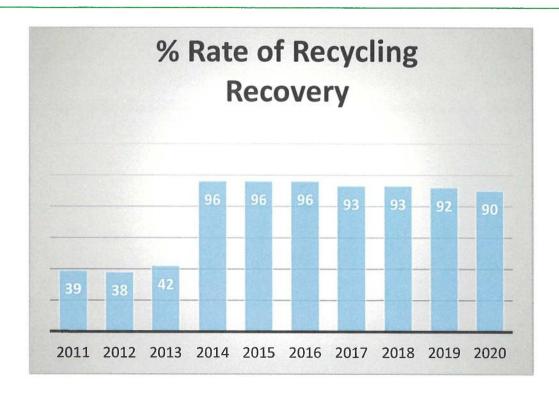

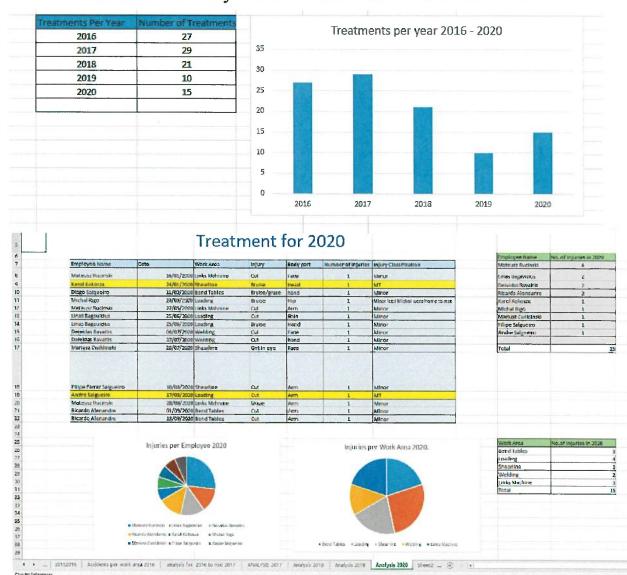
